

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
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#### **ABHINAVIANS REJOICE IN** THE SPIRIT OF GURPURAB

World Television Day was established in 1996 by the United Nations. World Television Day celebrates the daily value of television as a symbol of communication and globalization.




Television is one of the single greatest technological advances of the 20th century, serving to educate, inform, entertain and influence our decisions and opinions.

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



### PORTANCE OF READING






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
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
